### How will my son be assessed?

- Geography is assessed once or twice a term though a mixture of written tests, geographical enquiries and extended writing pieces. These are marked using Doodle. Each assessment measures a set of 10 – 15 skills which are marked as following:
  - Red- Skill not yet shown
  - Amber- Skill developing
  - Green- Skill secure

### Skills are groups into the following categories:

- Geographical skills ( e.g. the ability to complete grid refernces)
- Geographical Knowledge (e.g. an understanding of places and their characteristics)
- Geographical Understanding ( e.g. to look at change over space and time and how this affects the geography)

- There will also be an end of year exam covering all topics
- Classwork is marked once every 2 weeks(approx.) and students are expected to respond to written teacher feedback by making improvements on their work

### How can I support my son with Geography?

- Check his planner to make sure what homework has been set and when it needs to be completed.

- Encourage him to read over his work after it is completed to secure his learning and where appropriate make improvements.
- Check he is responding to teacher comments in his book (Using a different coloured pen).
- Watching the news, reading newspapers and being aware of current events can really help increase his awareness of issues relating to physical and human geography.
- Talk to your son and ask him what he is learning and therefore engage him in what he has learnt.
